The Tax Cuts Jobs Act (TCJA) was signed into law on December 22nd, 2017. The TCJA resulted in a \$2.1 billion decrease in net income driven by the deemed repatriation charge and adjustments to the value of tax oriented investments, partially offset by a benefit from the revaluation of JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A's net deferred tax liability. The TCJA impact is an estimate which may be refined throughout 2018 based on new information or interpretations. The impact of the TCJA was calculated based on all available information and published legislative guidance however certain amounts are considered to be estimates under Staff Accounting Bulletin No. 118. We anticipate refinements will result from the issuance of future legislative and accounting clarity as well as those in the normal course including the provision to return process and resolution of tax audits

However, the information reported in Schedule RI-E, item 2.g; Schedule RC-O, Memorandum items 6 through 9, 14, 15, and 18; and Schedule RC-P, items 7.a and 7.b, is regarded as confidential and will not be released to the public. BANKS CHOOSING TO SUBMIT THE NARRATIVE STATEMENT SHOULD ENSURE THAT THE STATEMENT DOES NOT CONTAIN THE NAMES OR OTHER IDENTIFICATIONS OF INDIVIDUAL BANK CUSTOMERS, REFERENCES TO THE AMOUNTS REPORTED IN THE CONFIDENTIAL ITEMS IDENTIFIED ABOVE, OR ANY OTHER INFORMATION THAT THEY ARE NOT WILLING TO HAVE MADE PUBLIC OR THAT THE **PRIVACY** WOULD COMPROMISE OF **THEIR** CUSTOMERS. DISCLOSURE OF THE STATEMENT SHALL NOT SIGNIFY THAT ANY FEDERAL SUPERVISORY AGENCY HAS VERIFIED OR CONFIRMED THE ACCURACY OF THE INFORMATION CONTAINED THEREIN. A STATEMENT TO THIS EFFECT WILL APPEAR ON ANY PUBLIC RELEASE OF THE OPTIONAL STATEMENT SUBMITTED BY THE MANAGEMENT OF THE REPORTING BANK.
