Security Features

2. **Pantograph:** A pantograph with embedded word "VOID" is included in the lower left hand corner to prevent fraudulent duplication.
3. **Microlettering:** Tiny letters are printed on the cheque, which are difficult to reproduce accurately and can be seen clearly only under magnification.
4. **CTS-2010 Standards:** Cheques are designed to comply with the Cheque Truncation System (CTS) 2010 standards, which enhance security and facilitate faster processing. All new cheques carry printer name along with "CTS-2010" lettering.
5. **UV Ink:** Bank's logo is printed on the upper left hand corner with ultraviolet ink, which is visible only under UV light, adding an extra layer of security.
6. **Printing of account number:** All cheques have account number pre-printed to avoid any risk of fraud or tampering.

These design and security features are crucial in maintaining the integrity and trustworthiness of cheques as a payment method in India. Always ensure that these features are present and intact when handling cheques.
