

Important note on account format change for HSBC, OCBC and SBI

As a result of the industry-wide upgrade of the Interbank GIRO system led by the Association of Banks in Singapore (ABS), please note that the account number format for Hongkong Shanghai Banking Corporation (HSBC), Oversea-Chinese Banking Corporation (OCBC) or State Bank of India (SBI) will be changed. The full account number will be expanded to include the first three digits branch code followed by the existing account numbers. For fund transfers to any of these three banks, you will be required to enter the new account number going forward. A sample of this change is summarized below.

We will update this change on your behalf for all existing GIRO application arrangements and/or instructions sent to JPMorgan prior to the go-live date.
